Treatment of a person or group as insignificant or peripheral.

To disempower, disenfranchise, exclude

The act of treating someone or something as if they are not important

Marginalization occurs when a person or groups of people are less able to do things or access basic services or opportunities.

Synonyms. Oppressed; vulnerable

People who are socially marginalized don't have the same social opportunities as others. They can't go to the same clubs, reasonably access the same shops or services, and they often even live in segregated, socially excluded communities.


To relegate to an unimportant or powerless position within a society or group

Marginalization encompasses structural, interpersonal, and intergroup dynamics that perpetuate inequality and exclusion.

To remove to or keep in a position without influence in a society or group.

What is marginalization and what does it look like?


- Not being able to make choices


Marginalization is a set of interests


Marginalization is a set of interests empowered by these forces

Prompt: What attitudes or beliefs influence how people think about disability, accessibility, and belonging in the community?





Prompt: What are the tools, policies, practices, and resources that influence marginalization of people with IDD?




Marginalization is a set of interests empowered by these forces that use these tools as a response to these problems

Prompt: What are people reacting to? In fear of? Trying to accomplish?




Marginalization is a set of interests empowered by these forces that use these tools as a response to these problems that affect/target these people
