




Exclusion in schools is a set of interests

Prompt: Who influences or controls the practices and policies that can exclude children?




Exclusion in schools is a set of interests empowered by these forces

Prompt: What attitudes or beliefs influence how people think about disability, accessibility, and belonging?




Exclusion in schools is a set of interests empowered by these forces that use these tools

Prompt: What are the tools, policies, practices, and resources that influence exclusion/inclusion?




Exclusion in schools is a set of interests empowered by these forces that use these tools as a response to these problems

Prompt: What are people reacting to? In fear of?




Exclusion in schools is a set of interests empowered by these forces that use these tools as a response to these problems that affects/targets these people

Prompt: Who feels the effects of exclusionary practices?




Exclusion in schools is a set of interests empowered by these forces that use these tools as a response to these problems that affects/targets these people and produces these results
